

HC dismisses 3rd PIL seeking ouster of Kejriwal as Delhi CM

Not A Legal Issue, LG Competent To Take Call: Court



New Delhi: Declining to give directions on the third PIL within 10 days seeking removal of Arvind Kejriwal as Delhi chief minister following his arrest, Delhi high court on Thursday said it is the jailed AAP leader's "personal call".

Asking if there was any precedent of a court imposing President's rule or governor's rule, the court said, "This is a practical issue, not a legal issue. We won't go into this. Can we declare that the govt is not functioning? Governor is fully competent. He does not need our guidance. There is a discretion to take the call. Let's not anticipate that they won't discharge their functions. We can't venture into this".

Prioritise MP & MLA criminal cases: Delhi HC

New Delhi: Delhi high court has asked its judges to prioritise hearing of all criminal cases, appeals and revisions concerning MPs and MLAs, reports Vineet Upadhyay. A division bench passed the order while dealing with a suo motu PIL to monitor cases against MPs and MLAs in trial courts as well as the HC. HC also directed special MP/MLA courts to first give priority to those cases against legislators who are punishable by death or life term, subsequently to cases punishable with jail for five years or more, and then hear other cases.

Delhi LG office to Centre: AAP govt filing false cases

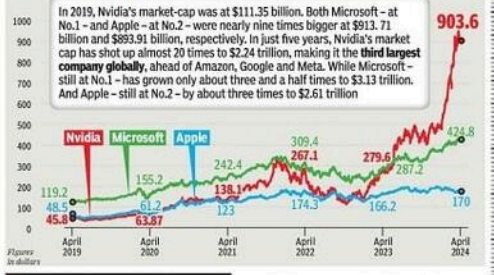
Supreme Court too had come down heavily on Delhi govt for keeping the proposals pending for such a long period, he added.

Why ordinary chips are not good for AI machines

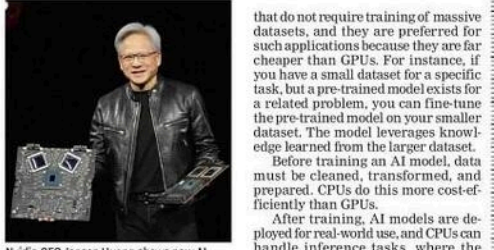
Unlike Plain Vanilla CPU Chips, GPUs Used in Gaming are Great Multitaskers. That's Why They've Become Backbone Of AI While Newer Types Of Specialised Chips Evolve

In the 1980s, personal computers gained prominence, largely thanks to the CPU (central processing unit). The CPU is the brain behind your computer, performing basic arithmetic, logic, and input/output operations specified by program instructions. Notable giants in the CPU field include Intel and AMD.

Their cores are more resource-efficient, meaning they perform more work for every energy unit they receive compared with CPU cores. High memory bandwidth: AI chips provide fast access to memory, essential for training large neural networks. Customised architectures: These chips are purpose-built for AI tasks, allowing for better performance.

But computer graphics requires more computing power than what CPUs provide, and thus emerged GPUs (graphics processing unit), which excel at executing multiple instructions parallelly at the same time. GPUs became essential also to render real-time 3D graphics in video games. Nvidia has been a big player in GPUs. The greater computing power GPUs provide makes them more expensive than CPUs.

Why GPUs for AI The importance of GPUs grew as AI advanced. Training of AI systems required massive amounts of data that needed to be processed instantly. The computing capacity that GPUs enabled, in combination with the emergence of machine learning and deep-learning techniques, allowed the development of powerful AI solutions.

Nvidia Becomes King Nvidia had been a dominant player in the GPU market since the 1990s, primarily serving the gaming industry. In the 2010s, the company's founder and CEO Jensen Huang made a huge bet that Nvidia's GPUs could be used for AI workloads. That bet paid off. Now, the company almost holds a monopoly; their DGX A100 and H100 chips are flagship AI chips for training and inference in data centres worldwide. The company's latest chip - Blackwell B200 GPU - will start shipping later this year.

3 Types Of AI Chips GPUs: Originally for graphics, GPUs now serve as AI workhorses. ASICs (application-specific integrated circuits): They are highly specialised chips and can be optimised for AI workloads, like Google's Tensor Processing Unit (TPU) chip. FPGAs (field-programmable gate arrays): These are customisable chips and can be made suitable for specific AI tasks. CPUs Too Can Be Used Even though they are general-purpose, CPUs can be used for AI applications that do not require training of massive datasets, and they are preferred for such applications because they are far cheaper than GPUs. For instance, if you have a small dataset for a specific task, but a pre-trained model exists for a related problem, you can fine-tune the pre-trained model on your smaller dataset. The model leverages knowledge learned from the larger dataset. Before training an AI model, data must be cleaned, transformed, and prepared. CPUs do this more cost-effectively than GPUs. After training, AI models are deployed for real-world use, and CPUs can handle inference tasks, where the trained model makes predictions on new data. CPUs are also used in devices like smart cameras, voice assistants, and sensor-based applications for running lightweight AI models. Lightweight AI powers real-time anomaly detection (like identifying defective parts in an assembly line), smart speakers, and facial recognition on mobile devices. Competition Heating Up At Top End Intel's Gaudi line of chips and AMD's Instinct MI300 target AI training workloads and compete directly with Nvidia's GPUs. Meta and Google have their own AI chip platforms that they use internally. Well-known tech giants like Samsung, Broadcom and Qualcomm are also involved in AI chip research and production. There are also startups like Cerebras that are trying to shake up the sector with their specialised AI chips. The AI chip landscape is dynamic, with startups and research institutes continually pushing boundaries. As generative AI gains prominence, demand for these chips is expected to soar, driving innovation and competition in the sector.

Grocery items among big pre-poll seizures: Officials

Police haul of freebies in Shivmoga included grocery hampers of rice and ragi bags, salt and oil packets. Per Venkatesh, "Groceries are big among the seizures this time. Groceries are kept for distribution across various godowns." Obviously, there are no bills attached. Data accessed by TOI show Shivmoga freebies include tomatoes, Google TV boxes, tea bags, and scented tobacco. "We are uncertain if this is going to be used to induce voters or party workers, but hoarding such huge quantities without proper bills is an offence," Venkatesh told TOI.

A huge consignment of panna masala packets, weighing 4,000kg and worth Rs 10 lakh, was seized in Bidar district. A senior election officer from Bidar said using panna masala as a freebie is unusual. The usual 'gift' is clothing. Chikkallapur police officials have seized 96 expensive watches, costing Rs 24 lakh. "These watches are expensive and not easily available in the city... the cache is linked to an Andhra-based party," said a police official.

Court-monitored probe: Kol HC reserves order

Kolkata: A two-judge bench of Kolkata HC has reserved its judgment after hearing extensive arguments on petitions urging a court-monitored probe by an independent commission into allegations of torture, sexual abuse of women in Sandeshkhali, and land-grabbing by Trinamool strongman Sheikh Shahjahan and his associates, reports Subrata Chattaraj. Advocate Priyanka Tibrewal, also a BJP functionary, presented 600 affidavits from Sandeshkhali women, detailing instances of land-grabbing and torture, with one affidavit alleging the same. The court directed advocate general Kishore Datta to submit all 43 FIRs and chargesheets related to Shahjahan and his aides filed until Jan 5, the day ED officials came under attack while trying to conduct a search at Shahjahan's home. Datta also raised concerns about the influx of PILs, questioning their "political" or "personal interest" litigations.

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Only consumable liquor under state control: Centre

New Delhi: Union govt told SC on Thursday that a conjoint reading of regulating entries in central, state and current lists of the Constitution projected states' jurisdiction over liquors consumable by humans for intoxication but all other variants, including industrial alcohol, came under central domain. After states relied heavily on Entry 8 of List II to seek full regulating control over all kinds of alcohol, including the industrial variety, attorney general R Venkatarmani told a nine-judge bench led by C.J.D N.V. Chandrachud that the limit was test for Entry 8 was the human factor introduced by the Constitution framers by specifying "liquor" is intoxicating effect. "Intoxicating must be seen only with reference to impact owing to human consumption. That which is not consumable by humans will not fall within the meaning of 'intoxicating'. Notwithstanding

the long history of definitions of 'liquor' to include liquids with alcohol content, it cannot be canvassed that human consumption part can be kept aside," AG said. Non-potable alcohol, including denatured spirits or industrial alcohol, will be unfit for human consumption, whereas entries on this in state list referred only to 'liquors for human consumption', Venkatarmani said while placing Centre's stand before the bench, also comprising Justices Hrishikesh Roy & S Oka, B V Nagarathna, J B Pardiwala, M M Misra, S C Sharma and A G Mishra. He said Entry 8 of List I, untrammelled by any other liquor regulating entry in state list, empowered Parliament to exercise overarching regulatory control through legislation in public interest over the liquor industry, except those which manufactured potable alcohol. This overarching control would extend to its trade, commerce, supply and sale, he said. Arguments will resume on Tuesday.

SG cites Ghalib to boost argument

Even as alcohol dominated arguments for three consecutive days before the three-judge bench of SC, the court had been complete without a mention of celebrated Urdu poet Mirza Ghalib. Unlike the daily dose of entertainment which came from lighter comments of judges, a lawyer amused the bar and bench on Thursday by arguing that consumption did not mean drinking liquor, as humans also consume industrial alcohol, used in nail polish, wood varnish, paint, etc. Justice Roy asked, "So you are arguing that lips may not be needed for consuming liquor?" Solicitor general said the argument was akin to what Ghalib had said centuries ago: "Go haith jo jumbish nah aakho me to dum hai, rehne do abhi sagar-o-meena mere age (Though my hands are not strong enough to hold a glass of wine, my eyes are strong enough, let the bottle and glass be kept before me)." ❧
