Delhi Police arrest truck driver in Shastri Park hit-and-run case



The driver was turned in by the truck's owner to the Motor Accident Claim Tribunal two days after the accident in Delhi's Shastri Park.

NEW DELHI : The Delhi Police on Thursday arrested a 31-year-old man in connection with the Shastri Park hit-and-run case early on Monday in which a canter truck mowed down three people and injured two others sleeping on the central verge of a road. Arjun, a resident of Fatehpur in Uttar Pradesh, was turned in by the truck's owner to the Motor Accident Claim Tribunal (MACT) on Wednesday, and he was subsequently arrested by the police.

The truck's owner, Rahul Singh, told the police Arjun had been working as a driver for him for the past five years. The police's investigation also revealed that the truck had five challans pending against it, with the most recent issued in December 2022. The police said Arjun was driving the canter truck through Shastri Park from Seelampur on Monday at around 4.30 am, and was on his way to the Iron Bridge when he lost control of the vehicle and veered onto the central verge. Arjun fled the spot, leaving the truck behind, they added.

According to the police, one of the men who was killed in the accident was identified as Mohammad Jakir, 35, a resident of Bihars' Katihar, and the two others remained unidentified. Mushtaq, 35, and Kamlesh, 36, who were injured in the accident, were taken to Jag Pravesh Chandra Hospital by emergency responders.

1984 anti-Sikh riots: Delhi court orders framing of charges against Congress leader Jagdish Tytler

NEW DELHI : Almost 40 years after three Sikh men were burnt to death at the Pul Bangash Gurdwara in Delhi, a court ordered framing of charges against Congress leader Jagdish Tytler under sections 302 (murder) read with 109 (abetment) of the Indian Penal Code (IPC), among others.

The court also ordered charges to be framed against Jagdish Tytler for rioting (Section 147 of IPC) and promoting enmity between different groups based on religion, race, place of birth, residence, language, caste, or community (Section 153A of IPC) and being part of an unlawful assembly

(Section 143 of IPC). In its charge sheet filed against Tytler in May last year, the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) accused him of "inciting, instigating and provoking the mob" that had assembled near the Pul Bangash Gurdwara at Azad Market, Bara Hindu Rao, on November 1, 1984. The mob had allegedly gone on to burn the gurdwara along with three men — Sardar Thakur Singh, Badal Singh, and Gurcharan Singh. The complainant Lakhwinder Kaur, wife of deceased Badal Singh, was represented by Senior Advocate H S Phoolka and Advocate Gurbaksh Singh, and CBI was represented by Public



Prosecutor Amit Jindal.

Relying on the testimony of a witness, CBI claimed that Tytler instigated the mob by shouting "Kill the Sikhs, they have killed our mother!". The word "mother" referred to former prime minister Indira Gandhi, who was assassinated by her Sikh bodyguards a day earlier. Indira Gandhi was assassinated on October 31, 1984, by two of her bodyguards, Beant Singh and Satwant

Singh, to "avenge" the desecration of the Golden Temple during Operation Blue Star — a military operation by the armed forces conducted to remove Jarnail Singh Bhindranwale and other Sikh "militants" from the holiest site of Sikhism in Amritsar.

As reported earlier by , just three days after her death, approximately 3,350 Sikhs, as per government estimates, were massacred, 2,800 in Delhi itself. The case against Tytler was registered by CBI on November 22, 2005. In 2000, the Justice Nanavati Commission was set up by the Centre to inquire into the 1984 anti-Sikh riots in

Delhi. Following a report by the Commission, the Union Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) issued directions to the Central probe agency to investigate the case against Tytler and others.

On February 12, 2015, MHA also issued an order, constituting an SIT to "re-investigate" "appropriately" the "serious" criminal cases that had been filed in Delhi, but were closed. This SIT, comprising 69 people including four assistant commissioners of police, 11 inspectors, and two prosecutors, traced 293 such closed cases. After months, 199 cases were closed due to "incomplete, illegible" records or lack of witnesses.

Delhi Court grants bail to alleged conman Suresh Chandrasekhar in bribery case

Chandrasekhar will, however, remain in jail in other pending cases lodged against him.

NEW DELHI : A Delhi court on Friday granted bail to alleged conman Suresh Chandrasekhar in a bribery case related to the AIADMK's "two leaves" election symbol, noting that he had undergone detention for a period more than the maximum jail term specified for the offence he was accused to have committed.

Special Judge Vishal Gogne granted the relief to him on a personal bond of Rs 5 lakh. Chandrasekhar has been accused of acting as a middleman for AIADMK leader T T V Dinakaran and trying to bribe an Election



Commission of India (ECI) official to secure the party's two leaves symbol for the faction led by V K Sasikala. According to the prosecution, Rs 1.3 crore cash was recovered from the accused which was allegedly intended to be used for exercising undue influence with the ECI for obtaining a favourable election symbol for the Sasikala faction of the AIADMK. Chandrasekhar will, however, remain in jail in other pending cases lodged against him. The judge said in his order that Chandrasekhar's detention

beyond seven years "entails his mandatory release". "The accused has admittedly suffered detention beyond the maximum period of imprisonment and his release was not constrained by the law," the judge noted.

The judge said that the judicial interpretation of law "must necessarily be the bulwark against a police State". The repeated reiteration of "bail and not jail" as a rule in support of the value of liberty by the apex court ought to be honoured when reading the bail-related provisions of law, the

judge said. He said the delay in proceedings was not capable of being ascribed to the accused as he was entitled to exercise his right. "If the proceedings then came to be stayed by the high court or the Supreme Court, the cannot be penalised," the judge said. The prosecution had opposed Chandrasekhar's bail application citing the gravity of the allegations.

It alleged that the delay in the trial in the case and Chandrasekhar's consequent long detention was caused by him as he challenged the order on charge and the proceedings before the high court.

HC seeks Mumbai Police reply on safety measures taken for Matunga(E) college, school girls

MUMBAI : The Bombay High Court on Friday directed Mumbai Police to file an affidavit providing details of security measures in place that ensure safety and security of students of girls college in Matunga (East) and a school.

The HC was hearing a plea by two educational institutes, challenging construction of the Foot Over Bridge (FOB) that allegedly created an unsafe environment for girl students due to presence of drug addicts/peddlers, instances of theft and other anti-social activities.

The court said that the safety of girl students in the area requires special

measures as the concerned area is surrounded by slums and the possibility of mischief that would place them in a dangerous situation cannot be ruled out. A division bench of Chief Justice Devendra Kumar Upadhyaya and Justice Amit Borkar was hearing plea by Gujarati Kelavani Mandal which runs Amulakh Amichand Bhimji school along with Seva Mandal Education Society that run a girls college near Rafi Ahmed Kidwai Marg, Matunga (East).

Senior advocate Mihir Desai claimed that an adjacent plot which is claimed by the Railways, and was contested by the petitioner, was suddenly planned to be converted into a landing station of the FOB passing over railway tracks connecting the West and East side of the Kings Circle station. He mentioned the presence of several anti-social elements and drug addicts in the vicinity that likely endangered the security of thousands of girls. Despite CCTV cameras on the premises and regular complaints made at Matunga Police station, petitioners continue to face the problem, Desai said. The bench noted that the affidavit in reply filed by

the inspector of Matunga Police station contained general assertions for measures, which are normally taken by any police station for maintaining law and order. However, no specific details mentioned safety measures for girl students attending the petitioner institutions.

The court thereupon directed the police to file an affidavit within two weeks, personally vetted by the Police Commissioner, that provided details of measures already taken or which the local police intends to put in place to ensure security of the girl students concerned. It said the affidavit should also state measures the local police station has been taking to deal with the threat to the safety of girl students on account of use of the FOB. "The security and safety of all students, girl students particularly in the area, require special measures to be taken for the reason that petitioners in the said writ petition have asserted that the area is surrounded by slums and possibilities of mischiefs posing danger to the security and safety of girl students cannot be denied," the bench noted and posted further hearing to September 13.
